

JUVENILE REENTRY PROJECT

We provide free civil legal services for young people 24 years old or younger reentering their communities after leaving the Juvenile Justice System.

RECORD SEALING

Your juvenile record can affect your ability to get a job, find housing, or acceptance into school. We can:

- Show you what is on your juvenile record.
- Tell you whether a record can be sealed so that it cannot be seen by the public.
- Request the court to seal your record and represent you at court hearings.

EDUCATION

We can:

- Help you get reenrolled and represent you at reenrollment or transition meetings.
- Help you deal with suspensions and expulsions.
- Help you get needed education services (like an IEP or similar services).
- Making sure your prior school credits transfer to your current school.

HOUSING

We can:

- Help you find housing.
- Look over your lease before you sign.
- Help you get your rent deposit back.
- Explain your rights and what you are required to do as a tenant.
- Explain your landlord's rights and what he/she is required to do as a landlord.
- Help with getting your landlord to make necessary repairs in your home.
- Help prevent your landlord kicking you out and represent you at court hearings.
